Niall heads the Disability Policy function of the Department and is responsible for the development of policy on disability, including for the coordination of disability strategies and for relevant legislation. The Disability Policy team holds responsibility for the Assisted Decision-Making (Capacity) (Amendment) Bill 2022."

Áine is a partner in public and administrative law in St. John Solicitors. Áine is a member of the Council of the Law Society and many of its committees. She was appointed by Minister Lynch to the Expert Steering Group on the Review of the Mental Health Act 2001 (2012-2015). In May 2022, she was appointed by the Minister for Justice to the Civil Legal Aid Review Group. Áine was one of the first solicitors appointed Senior Counsel in October 2020.
