Mr Justice Liam Kennedy

Having originally qualified as a barrister and solicitor in New Zealand (which has a fused profession), working in Wellington and then London, Mr. Justice Kennedy was with A&L Goodbody for over 30 years and was head of the firm's litigation team. He represented clients in international disputes and regulatory investigations, including in all jurisdictions of the Irish courts. He served as a Law

Society of Ireland Council Member for 14 years and is a former Chair of its Litigation Committee and of the International Bar Association's Litigation Committee. He was one of the first Irish solicitors to be nominated as a Senior Counsel. He was also a leader of the Ireland for Law initiative, an Irish government taskforce promoting Ireland as a venue for international legal services and transactions. He was appointed to the High Court in July 2023 and currently deals with chancery matters and the bankruptcy and examinership lists.
